Report.

Waveney welcomed Rangers to the Denes for their third encounter this season in this first round Ipswich & Suffolk Open Cup match.

The first 5 minutes saw early Waveney pressure with George popping off an early shot and Jordan was strong in the tackle to set up Ben who shot wide. The next 5 minutes belonged to Rangers who moved the ball about well and some excellent play resulted in a player shooting wide. From a corner Waveney had to be alert as Rangers created a good chance, Rangers then had a further shot which Bradley gathered. After the opening 10 minute period the half belonged to Waveney who created chance after chance.

A delightful move was started in the centre circle by Sam who controlled and passed to Liam Brown he moved the ball down the line to Joe who beat his man and put in the perfect through ball for Ben to run on to and slide the ball under the advancing keeper for a one nil lead to Waveney. Joe had an excellent chance to increase the lead and a good one two between Joe and Ben resulted in Ben slipping in Jordan whose chip had the keeper beaten but a defender came to Rangers rescue when he headed off the line. Waveney were now playing some excellent football, Jordan fed in Ben who shot but the keeper saved and then Ben returned the compliment but Jordan also wasted his chance.

Sam then had a chance but shot inch's wide and Jordan stretched his legs to beat his defender but with the keeper advancing he did a cross shot that eluded the on running Ryan and also just went wide of the post. Keelan went on a super mazy run beating 3 players and as he headed towards the bye line cut back to Jordan who in turn found Ben but his shot shaved the post. Waveney's pressure finally paid off with a minute to go of the half when a corner was headed towards goal by Bailey which the keeper could only bundle over the line.

During the break Waveney were told to do exactly the same as they had done in the first half and If Waveney's play in the first half had been a joy to watch with a super display of how football should be played the opening 15 minutes of the second half was totally the opposite, a team that struggled to hold any sort of shape or may I say it a team who thought the game was won. Within 3 minutes Rangers reduced the arrears with a really well worked goal and after 9 minutes the scores were level when failure to clear allowed Rangers to score. Rangers continued to attack as they smelt victory as by this time Waveney were on the ropes.

It took a little sustained pressure from Waveney to give them back some self belief and after 20 minutes Jordan received the ball with his back to goal, he then beat his marker and played the ball to Ryan who burst in on goal, he unleashed his shot but the keeper could only parry and Jordan who had continued his run slotted the ball home in to the empty net.

Rangers needed to attack if they wanted to stay in the competition and they played the ball about really well and got in to some really dangerous positions, Bradley was beat on one occasion but the post came to Waveney's rescue and two goal bound efforts were cleared off the line by Keelan and Jordan. Waveney were looking for the gaps this left and a neat pass found Ryan who when his marker came to him fed in the unmarked Ben but he blazed his shot over the bar.

Waveney held firm in what was a truly great game of football from both teams.
