### Report:

Waveney survived a potentially tricky away tie at Norwich CEYMS, emerging as 4-1 victors. CEYMS were arguably the better side for the opening minutes as Waveney struggled to compete with the physicality of the hosts. Vital last ditch tackles from Gamble and Evans prevented the visitors going behind; and after this reprieve Waveney took full advantage by scoring twice in ten minutes.

Paul Hunter was the scorer of both goals. His first, a powerfully executed header crashed in off the underside of the crossbar after a cross from the left. Hunter soon doubled his lead after being the quickest to react in the area. The home keeper could only parry a shot from Aldis and with every player culpable of ball-watching, Hunter found himself all alone to dispatch the rebound. After weathering the CEYMS storm, Waveney were now in complete control as the hosts offered little in the second period.

Aldis was now having lots of joy on the left, repeatedly finding himself in yards of space and threatening the CEYMS defence. The front four were well supported by Scarff and Sam Willgoss in midfield, who efficiently mopped up any danger from the opposition and provided Waveney with the platform to attack in numbers. Waveney's free flowing style of play was in evidence for their third goal. Gamble charged up the right flank and after playing a 'one-two' with Barker, showed great composure to hold off his challenger and beat the keeper with a fierce drive.

Andy Ballard was solid as ever at full back, combining frequently with Aldis to provide a constant threat down the left flank. It was this combination which provided Waveney's fourth. Aldis received the ball from Ballard on the left and skipped past a number of challenges. After finding himself in what appeared an almost impossible position on the byline, he fired in from the acutest of angles to complete a fine individual effort. CEYMS did score a consolatory effort but by this time the game was won and Waveney had secured an impressive away victory.
