Report:

In a topsy-turvy game, Waveney eventually edged out a spirited Hindringham side, but not after suffering a number of scares. The home side started the strongest, pinning the opposition in their own half for most of the opening minutes. Aldis clattered the crossbar and Scarff saw his deft lob fall agonisingly wide; but for all their pressing Waveney were lacking the cutting edge required to open the scoring. After weathering the initial storm, Hindringham began to show some promise and created a few chances of their own. As the game moved towards the interval, both teams were forced to play most of their football in the middle of the pitch, with chances at a premium.

The second half witnessed a higher tempo as both teams shipped goals in a suprisingly open second half. Waveney were the first to take the initiative. Barker latched on to an intricate flick from Hunter and although his effort was smothered, Scarff was on hand to lash home.

Almost immediately, Hindringham responded with two goals of their own. The equaliser arrived after persistent work from the centre forward, slotting home from an acute angle. Hindringham then took the lead. A probing free kick was whipped in from the left and needing only a touch, the opposition duly obliged in heading past Willgoss. This forced Waveney to raise their game once more and it did not take long for them to restore parity. Aldis cannoned his drive against the bar and once again Scarff was on cue to loop his header over the keeper.

Waveney were now firmly on top and the third goal followed soon after. Hunter found himself with time in the area and managed to pick out Aldis; who slid it past the keeper via a slight deflection. Littler and Renshaw were soon introduced to the game and in a matter of minutes their direct play helped the home side to take the game away from Hindringham. The fourth goal arrived after Gamble crossed from the byline, finding Scarff to glance home for a well taken hat-trick. The home side were being granted acres of space to carve out their openings. The fifth and final goal came about after littler skipped past a number of challenges to find Scarff; who rounded off proceedings with his fourth of the match.
