Waveney's hard run in began with the long awaited visit of Buxton. The game started at a frantic pace as both tried to get their flowing football underway. It didn't take long before the net busting resumed a swift footballing move involving most of the Waveney team ended with Substitute Ballard knocking home at the far post with his first touch. Cue more high fives.

The visitors did get a goal back against the run of play but the black and golds held strong and continued in their search for another and they didn't have to wait long. Beecher finding himself in a pocket of space in the Buxton box spun his man to place the ball out of the big goalies grasp for 6-1.
